

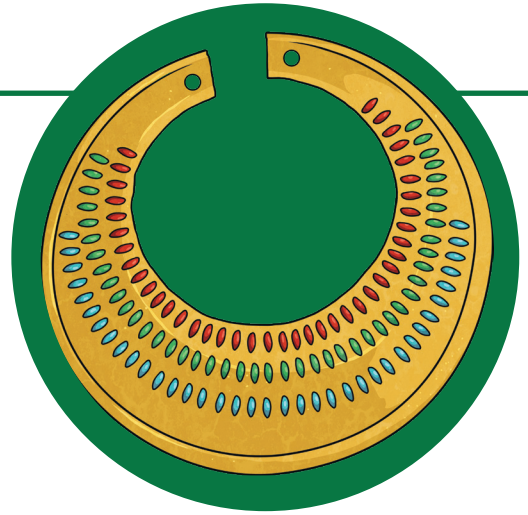
Egyptian Jewellery

Ancient Egyptians liked to wear jewellery and both men and women wore necklaces, bracelets and earrings. Semi-precious stones were used in jewellery, including carnelians, amethysts and turquoise. Wealthy people wore jewellery made of gold and precious stones. Less wealthy people had jewellery made from bone, stone or artificial gemstones.

Follow these instructions to make your own Egyptian collar.

You will need:

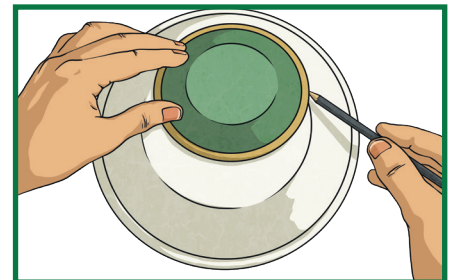
- A large paper plate
- A smaller plate or a saucer
- Gold, light blue, green and red paint
- Two types of pasta shapes, such as penne and orzo
- Pencil
- Paintbrushes
- Newspaper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Hole punch
- Thread



Instructions:

1.

Place the smaller plate on top of the paper plate. The smaller plate should be towards the top of the paper plate.

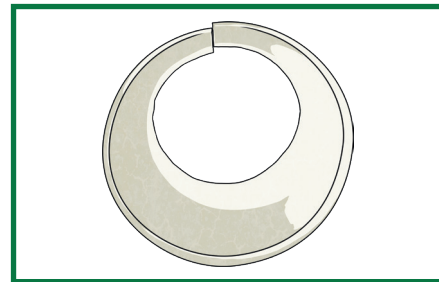


2.

Draw around the smaller plate.

3.

Cut a slit from the top of the paper plate and then cut out the smaller circle.

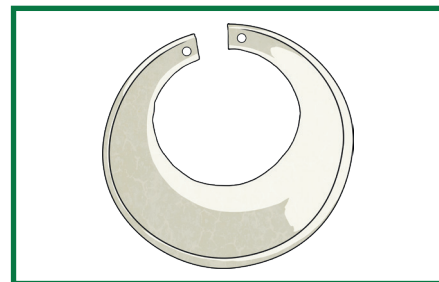


4.

Try putting the collar around your neck. If it is too tight, you might need to cut the circle again to make it a bit bigger.

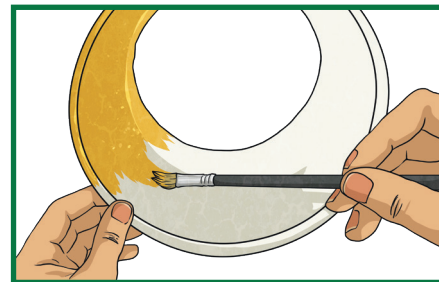
5.

Using the hole punch, put a hole at the top of either side of the paper plate on either side of the slit.



6.

Paint the paper plate gold.



7.

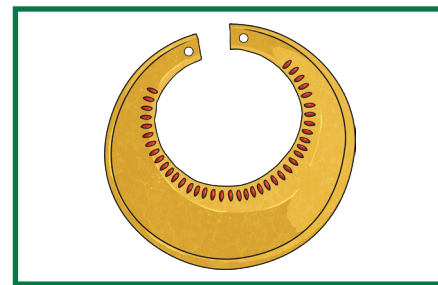
Place your first choice of pasta shapes on the newspaper and paint light blue.

8.

Place your second choice of pasta on the newspaper and paint half of it green and the other half red.

9.

Glue the red pasta in a row, going across the plate. Do not start right from the end and do not go quite to the other end.



10.

Repeat step 9 with the green pasta in a row underneath the red pasta.

11.

Repeat step 9 with the light blue pasta in a row underneath the green pasta.

12.

Tie a piece of thread through each hole and make a knot to secure it. You can use this thread to carefully tie the collar around your neck.
