Overview



We revisit world maps and look at some of the natural disasters that occur around the world. Volcanoes and earthquakes are considered in terms of what causes them and the effects and responses that humans have to them and how to prepare and survive them.

Plate tectonics = how the earth's crust is like a jigsaw and where the pieces meet there is friction leading to volcanoes and earthquakes.

Volcanic eruptions can be spectacular or much more ordinary and slower moving.

Earthquakes can be small tremors or devastating quakes with tsunamis, killing many people and destroying cities.

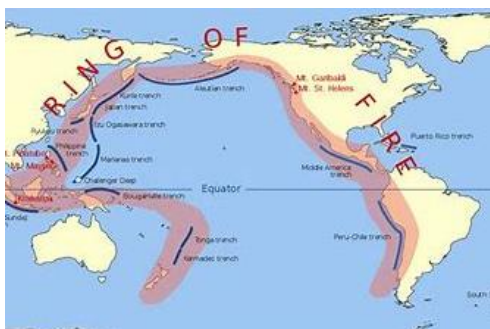


Main skills and or fieldwork



Locational map skills e.g. using an atlas, google earth, compass points, keys and scale to locate areas prone to natural disasters

The Ring of Fire = the area around the Pacific tectonic plate where lots of earthquakes and volcanic eruptions occur

magma

the hot liquid under the earth's surface

lava

name given to magma once it comes out of the ground

scoria

the rocks thrown out of a volcano

pyroclastic flow

the gas, lava and rocks that come out of a volcano when it is erupting

seismograph

machines which monitor the movement of the earth's surface

evacuation

moving away from the danger of a disaster

epicentre

The centre of an earthquakes eruption

magnitude

size in relation to how big an earthquake is
