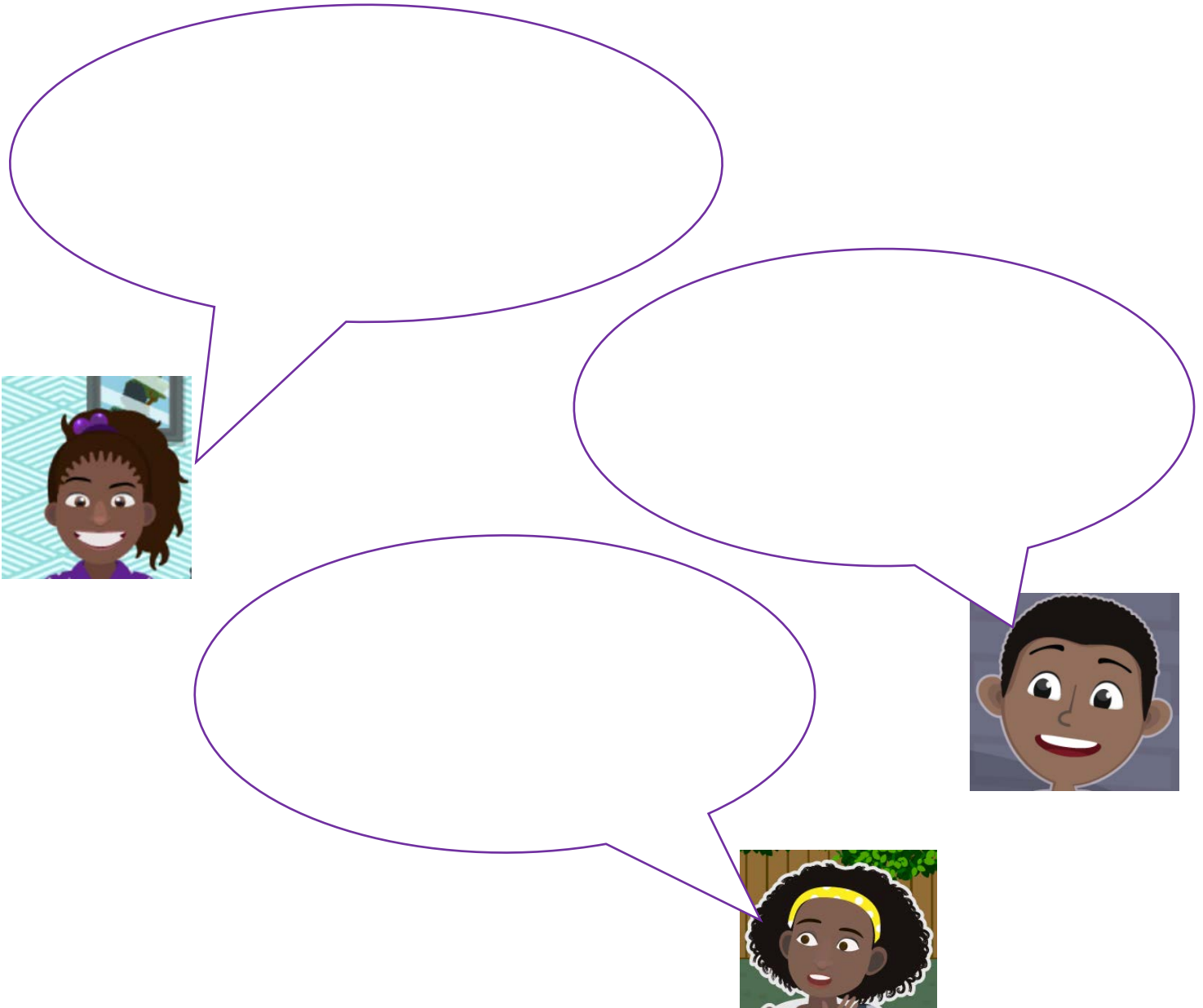


What did the children say?
