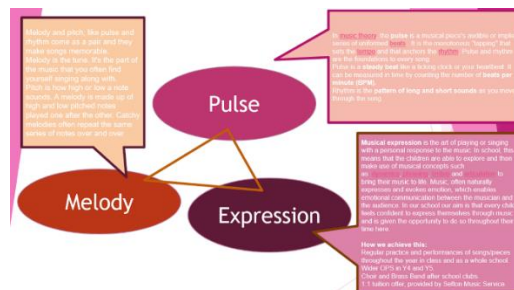


Here is a quick look into Music at our school!

- New for the 24/25 academic year is our ukulele after school club, which takes place each week. They performed at our Christmas end of term service in church and we can't wait to hear them perform new repertoire soon.

We continue to use the Charanga Model Music Curriculum (CMMC) to plan our engaging and fun, interactive music lessons. Children in Y4 and Y5 have brass WOPs lessons and in Y3, children learn to play a recorder, alongside CMMC.
