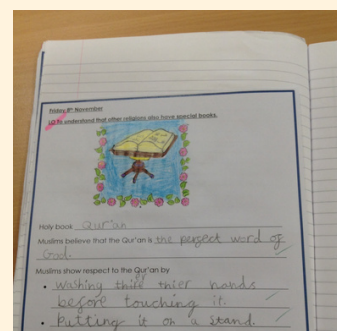


Our golden threads run throughout our R.E provision:

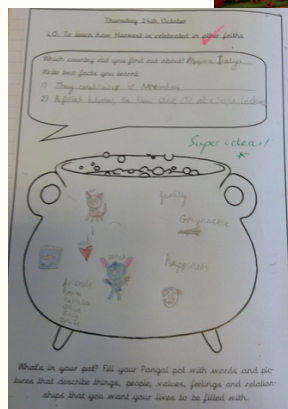
Our Year 6 class take part in the 'Smile' challenge each year - raising money for local causes which are important to them.
