Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off
when they're unwell.

There are government guidelines for schools about health
protection and managing specific infectious. These say when
children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone us
on the first day. Let us know that your child won't be in and
give us the reason. You need to tell us the reason just in
case we need to put additional measures in place.

the difference!



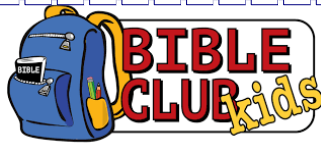
Our lovely reception children have
